Housing office addresses upcoming privatization

The U.S. Air Force selected Bal-four Beatty Communities, LLC to privatize military family housing for the Western Group Bases, to include Whiteman Air Force Base.

Global Strike Challenge ends with score-posting

BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La -- Air Force Global Strike Command's Global Strike Challenge competition culminated with traditional score posting and trophy presentations over two nights at Hoban Hall Nov. 8 and 9.

Spotlights, thumping music, mascots and giant video screens greeted winning teams who cheered and rushed to the stage to pose for celebratory photos while claiming their prizes as the champions of Global Strike Challenge. The competition connects the command

to its heritage while developing expertise and recognizing the "best of the best" in the bomber, missile and security forces areas.

More than 400 Airmen from Air Force Global Strike Command, Air Combat Command and Air Force Reserve Command competed for the right to take home the trophies until the next competition. For the second year in a row, the 90th Missile Wing from F.E. Warren AFB, Wyo., was named the "Best ICBM Wing," while the 28th Bomb Wing from Ellsworth AFB, S.D., was named "Best Bomb Wing."

Whose name do you know in Afghanistan?

KAPISA PROVINCE, Afghanistan (AFNS) -- Before I came to Afghanistan, I only knew what I heard about it on TV. I knew the names of only several notable insurgent leaders and trouble makers, but I didn't know the names of any good, regular people.

Like many of you, I knew the names of Osama bin Laden and Mohammed Omar and since I've set foot in Kapisa, I've seen firsthand some of the trouble they've made. But I've also met one of the good guys.

After one of our Afghan local police pay-day activities, I met Qand Agha, the chief of the Kapisa province's first local police unit. I expected him to come to me with a list of needs and requests as locals generally do here, but instead what I heard was a story of courage and sacrifice.

You see, Qand, at 28 (or so)-years-old, continues to lead a band of brothers defending his small village in Afghanistan's smallest province against Taliban domination, and he does it all with just one leg.

Qand lost his leg last December in a firefight with the Taliban near his village of Landakhel in the hotly contested key terrain district of Tagab in the eastern province of Kapisa.

He told me about the day he lost his left leg, giving details as if it had happened yesterday. He remembered heavy gunfire, explosions and casualties all around him. He remembered being on the edge of death and the "brave" coalition soldier who did not leave his side until the medical evacuation helicopter was able to fly him to safety.

With tears in his eyes, Qand recounted this battle and showed me some of the scars it and other battles had left him with. These scars also told a story. In Qand's voice I heard both fear and courage mingled together. And in his tears I saw something that I did not expect -- something elusive that, if nurtured, might make a better Afghanistan. I hope that the country's leaders can find more men like Qand and partner with them to keep Afghanistan out of the grip of terrorists.

According to reports from his village, Qand and his band of brothers have already started this work and the local populace has

begun to embrace "the concept of a village without insurgents."

Before being the first in the province to step forward for the risky work as a local policeman, Qand was a motorcycle mechanic in a nearby bazaar. When speaking of Afghan policemen, some call them corrupt. Some call them thugs, but I know at least one Afghan policeman who has sacrificed greatly for his country. Now, Qand's men call him "our brother." They know his voice, and they follow him into danger in order to make their community a safer place.

They call their team "Sar-Tom-Bah," in Pashto. The word commonly means stubborn, but when they say it they mean they are afraid of no one, and they are will never back down in a fight.

I was very privileged to talk with Qand, to hear his story, accomplishments and his troubles. Small in stature, Qand is passionate about his work of opposing the Taliban and protecting his family and neighbors. And he is passionate about surviving.

You see, before I came here, I didn't know the names of any good, regular people in Afghanistan, but after I met Qand Agha, I do now.

Global Strike Commander: Strive to be 'always better' through innovation

SHREVEPORT, La. -- Lt. Gen. James Kowalski, Air Force Global Strike Command commander, delivers the keynote address during the second annual Global Strike Challenge Technology and Innovation Symposium Nov. 9. The Symposium was held in conjunction with the Global Strike Challenge competition score posting and is an opportunity to develop relationships and exchange ideas with industry and academia partners who support the Air Force's newest Command.

SHREVEPORT, La. -- The commander of Air Force Global Strike Command closed the 2011 Global Strike Challenge Technology and Innovation Symposium by challenging attendees to think 'always better.'

About 600 Airmen, community leaders and industry partners gathered for Lt. Gen. Jim Kowalski's keynote address at the Shreveport Convention Center Nov. 9, where the general discussed the need for Air-

men to innovate, and the importance of leaders listening to their ideas.

"When we began the work to stand up Global Strike Command, we wanted to restore pride in our heritage, including our deep heritage of innovation," Kowalski said. "We must now leverage that heritage to allow us to be 'always better.'"

Kowalski said the innovative spirit is a defining characteristic of the Air Force.

"It is in the DNA of all Airmen--our service was born from technology," he said. "It is in our tactics, training and procedures. It is in our doctrine. It is how we organize our forces. But it also has to become how we think about our work every day."

"That is the enduring challenge for Global Strike Command," Kowalski said.

"We must challenge our organizations, both military and civilian, to have an appetite for innovation--and a culture that rewards the implementation of innovative solutions across doctrine, organization, training, equipment and personnel," he said.

Kowalski cited a list of challenges in "an increasingly complex, multi-polar world" that require Airmen to innovate, including non-state actors, historic ethnic and national conflict points, the proliferation of nuclear and missile technologies, climate change, natural disasters and the competition for resources.

Innovation is already happening in Global Strike Command, where the Airmen continue to impress Kowalski with "their hunger for change and their drive to be 'always better,'" he said.






on base and future residents about privatized housing and the changes taking place.”

BBC, in partnership with the installation, is scheduled to hold town hall meetings in early December to discuss privatized housing in more detail. Mass lease signing are scheduled to occur after the town hall meetings. The following is designed to address frequently asked questions prior to the town hall meeting.

1. Do I have to live in privatized housing?

Privatized housing is only mandatory for military members who are considered key and essential. Whiteman currently has 29 positions designated as key and essential, mostly consisting of command positions. Those who do not fall in this category may choose to live off-base or in privatized housing.

2. What if I don't like the options provided to me when I am offered privatized housing?

If the military member is not satisfied with what is available in privatized housing, he/she may choose to live off-base. The Housing Management Office will assist the military member by providing referral services regarding local real estate rental property listings and contacts.

3. How are rental rates determined and what does my rent include?

Initially, rent will be equal to 100 percent of member's basic allowance for housing at the dependent rate. Once electric and gas meters

are installed, which is estimated to occur within the first five years of privatization, rent will equal the member's BAH at the dependent rate minus 110 percent of the average utility cost. Until meters are installed, rent will include electric, gas, refuse collection, water and sewer, common area grounds and facility care. Once meters are installed and average utility rates are established, electric and gas will be paid from the member's utility allowance. For example: If a member's BAH is \$1,000 and the average electric and gas cost is \$100 rent would be \$1,000 minus \$110 (\$100 x 110 percent) which would equal \$890. The \$890 rent allotment is deducted from the member's BAH. The remaining \$110 (utility allowance) will be available to the member to pay for their electric and gas costs based on metered usage.

4. Is privatized housing cheaper than houses in the local community?

The cost of privatized housing relative to off-base housing depends on what is available in the local community.

5. Will I have to sign a lease to live in privatized housing?

Privatized housing is a private sector housing option like other off-base rental options. Therefore, a Tenant Lease Agreement must be signed.

The general discussed innovative ideas from Airmen, including building motorcycle practice pads on bases, combining IG inspections, and giving mobile security forces teams a wireless link into missile field security cameras.

Kowalski also mentioned several innovative ideas which started at Global Strike Command Headquarters, including the restructuring of the continuous bomber presence in Guam, which will save \$21 million a year.

Sustainment and modernization will also require innovative thinking, Kowalski said. He discussed the command's bomber fleet pushing past the half-century mark--the B-52 Stratofortress, scheduled to be in service "until they are past 80 years old" and the B-2 Spirit, which will be flying past 2050. The Minuteman III missiles will also be 60 years old when the new replacement system comes online sometime after 2030, Kowalski said.

"I don't know how the Global Strike Challenge of the future will score the new bomber or the new ICBM, but I expect they will bring

the same level of discipline, professionalism and innovation that we have seen here," Kowalski said.

The general thanked everyone in attendance for participating in the second-annual Global Strike Challenge, highlighting the benefit of bringing the "best of the best" competitors together with industry partners. Kowalski also thanked Lt. Gen. Paul Fouillard, Commander of the French Strategic Air Forces, and his team for attending the events for the second year in a row.

More than 480 competitors from across Air Force Global Strike Command, Air Combat Command and the Air Force Reserve Command traveled to the Shreveport-Bossier City area to attend the second-annual Global Strike Challenge Capstone symposium and score posting events Nov. 8-9.

Global Strike Challenge develops elite, highly-disciplined Airmen, builds esprit de corps, and recognizes the "best of the best" Airmen in missile and bomber operations, maintenance and security forces.


