Throughout the last year, I have been on a quest to document simple success strategies that can maximize career success. I have highlighted the power of rituals and goal-setting strategies in increasing personal performance. Avoid people who fill their lives with negativity and pessimism.

You probably know someone who always has a sarcastic remark or pessimistic outlook on anything that happens. He or she is always

blind to any positive result from a situation. When you set new goals, it's these people who are the first ones to shoot down your ideas and not give you any support. They sometimes do it in subtle ways, asking "Are you really sure you can do that?", or "Maybe you'll be one of the few that succeeds." You should encourage honest feedback from trusted friends, but avoid the constant pessimism that too many cling to.

Share your goals with the people who will support you.

You have probably been told that once you establish your goals, you should announce them to the world, as doing so will help keep you accountable. Maybe you have had trouble in the past keeping your goals. Well-intentioned family members and friends may remind you about these past failures. You do not need that negative energy on the path to success. Share your goals with people who you know will care about your success, who will cheer you on and who will support you.

Proximity is power. Who you associate with will determine how far you get in establishing your rituals and following through on your goals. Will you work with a group of people who will challenge you or one that will breed apathy? Will you join a group of people who will support or a group that will keep you down? Stay safe on Thanksgiving!

Did you know according to the National Fire Protection Association that Thanksgiving is the leading day of the year for home fires involving cooking equipment? Here are just a few tips for you to follow to stay safe in the kitchen this Thanksgiving from NFPA and your local fire department.

- Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children away from the stove. Have a three-foot kid-free safe zone around the cooking area.
- Make sure kids stay away from hot food or liquids. The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- Make sure turkeys are completely thawed before deep-frying.

- Keep the floor clear so you do not trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- Be sure electric cords from electric knives, coffee makers, plate warmers or mixers are not dangling off counters within reach of a child.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children.
- Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.
- Have activities planned for kids to keep them busy and out of the kitchen. Involve them in Thanksgiving preparations with recipes that can be done outside the kitchen area.

Motorcycle safety: The last ride of fall

As the riding season winds down and the weather turns to a more wintery mix, many of us riders find ourselves compelled to ride on the few clear, albeit cold, days remaining before winter fully strikes.

Keep in mind that it is only the end of the riding season; next spring will bring a new one and it is only a few months away. Do not go out and take unnecessary risks because you think you are running out of time. Be safe so you are able to ride again next season, and always ride within your means.

All motorists must take caution given the abundance of Missouri wildlife. Specifically, November starts the beginning of the rut; deer will be much more often crossing roads. The month of November has the highest amount of deer involved motorcycle collisions every year, according to the American Automobile Association.

Also keep in mind as the trees continue losing their leaves and the weather get wetter, a patch of road surface coated in wet leaves is extremely slippery and can cause serious traction issues for a motorcyclist. Those hazards, combined with the reduced daylight hours, may affect visibility and in turn decrease reaction time, making for possibly the most dangerous time of year to be on a motorcycle.

For the riders who believe a wreck will only affect them, I have a simple message for you -- you are wrong. Think about your family, your friends and loved ones. Keep them in mind next time you find yourself riding "spirited" down a stretch of road or taking unnecessary risks with yourself and your machine. As long as you are

in the military, you will always have a family and your injuries, or worse, your death, will always affect others.

So have fun out there, but be safe, ride responsibly and do not let yourself become another statistic.

Remember that you represent the military in every decision you make. Speeding and passing cars is dangerous not only for you as the rider, but also for those around you. Just because your bike may be capable of triple-digit speeds does not mean you should do it. Making one bad decision can change your life forever; it can also affect the Service Members' Group Life Insurance and your surviving family members.

So get out there and enjoy the final days of the 2013 riding season, but as you head out, be mindful of the weather, the road conditions and most importantly, your safety and everyone around you.

Fire hydrants flushing

The 509th Civil Engineer Squadron utilities section will begin the Missouri Department of Natural Resources-mandated requirement to flush hydrants from Nov. 18 to Nov. 22. Flushing hydrants is a yearly task that will improve water quality on Whiteman by removing any possible sediment from the distribution system. Personnel residing on base and all those using the base should keep the following warnings in mind when they observe hydrant flushing taking place: do not drive directly through the hydrant flow, do not let children play in the hydrant flow as they could be injured from the hydrants' pressure and if you notice discolored water, simply flush the water until it flows clear. Under no circumstances should laundry be done until clear water is obtained from the washer and verified by the user. Any person experiencing prolonged discolored water should contact the 509th CES customer service section at 660-687-6350.

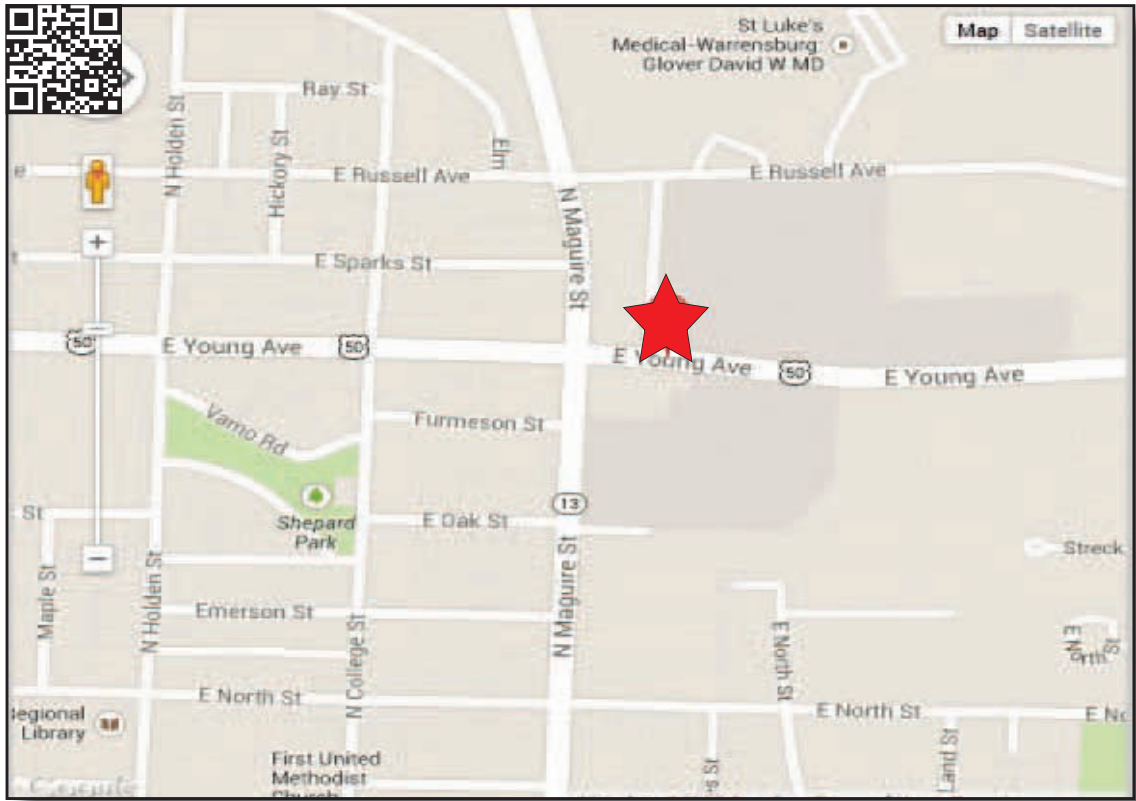

AF Leaders send Veterans Day message

Acting Secretary of the Air Force Eric Fanning, Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Mark A. Welsh III and Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force James Cody issued the following message to the Airmen of the United States Air Force:

Two days ago, on Nov. 9, 2013, three of the four surviving Doolittle Raiders performed their final toast in honor of the 80 brave men who volunteered for a daring raid on Tokyo on April 18, 1942. Launching 16 B-25 bombers off the deck of the USS Hornet, the Doolittle Raiders struck at the heart of the enemy when the war in the Pacific looked bleak. The leadership, innovation and courage of those 80 Raiders set the standard for America's Airmen. This may have been the Raiders' final toast, but as long as there is a United States Air Force, Airmen will toast the Doolittle Raiders.

This Veterans Day, we pay tribute to generations of men

and women who have served and still serve in uniform. We celebrate veterans of every Service who have built the finest military the world has ever seen. And we honor their service which has protected this great republic for more than two centuries. To those who made the ultimate sacrifice, we owe a debt that can never be repaid.

Today, we salute America's veterans and their families. We thank all the veterans who embody the highest ideals of this Nation that we cherish so dearly...people like Lt. Col. Dick Cole, one of the four living Doolittle Raiders. He said of volunteering for the raid, "They had a note on the company bulletin board that they were looking for volunteers for a dangerous mission ... I signed my name."

With great mustache comes great responsibility

Many Airmen think of November simply as the start of the winter season. However, to members of the 509th Comptroller Squadron, it means "No-shave November" is in full effect!

The Airmen in the squadron are participating in No-shave November to boost camaraderie and raise awareness for prostate and testicular cancer.

"I feel that with a great mustache comes great responsibility," said 2nd Lt. Zachariah Wood, 509th CPTS financial services officer. "It shows how Finance is really leading this wing by taking it one step forward, making it even better."

The idea of having men in the squadron and wing staff participate came from a conversation one of the Airmen had with his father over the phone.

"My dad was in the Air Force for 26 years," said Staff Sgt. John Proen, 509th CPTS NCO in charge of financial services. "He's had a mustache since the first day he could grow one."

Proen said it is interesting to see the similarities he has with his father when he grows out his mustache.

No-shave November also helps Airmen keep their spirits up when they need to give themselves a break from the daily grind of supporting personnel at Whiteman.

"It raises morale because it's fun," Proen said. "It's always funny coming in and seeing how much different someone's mustache looks each day."

Proen said that No-shave November has helped generate a brotherhood among the men in the finance office.

"We agreed that we're not going to shave our mustaches, regardless of whether or not our wives tell us how bad they think it looks," Proen

said. "We even said that if something bad happens, and if you wake up in the morning, you look up in the mirror and you're like, 'Oh my gosh what is going on here?! I need to take it off!' look at your recall roster, call your fellow brother and he'll talk you out of shaving your mustache and help you keep it."

To symbolize the camaraderie created by No-shave November, all participants signed a pact promising they will not shave their mustaches until the end of the month.

"We signed in red ink to make it as if you're signing your own blood as a joke," Proen said. "It makes it feel more official."

The biggest motivation for those who signed the pact was a group photo which will be taken at the end of the month to show the progression of everyone's mustaches, Proen said.

"If you decide to shave off the mustache, then you're not going to be in the photo," he said. "We have 16 people signed up now and no one's failed yet. Everyone's sticking with it, and I think everyone's going to stay strong until the end."

Before reaching 16 participants, there were only two partakers. However, thanks to word of mouth, the Airmen were able to gain more accomplices.

"There were a couple of people I thought who wouldn't make it this long mainly because they said, 'My wife's going to hate it and she's going to make me shave it,'" Proen said. "Your wives can get by seeing you for a month with a little hair on your face."

Although November is a busy part of the year for members in the finance office, No-shave November helps bring about laughter and a sense of brotherhood that keeps the mission moving.

"We have busier and slower times of the year," Proen said. "Regardless, we're still motivated to come in to work, hang out with the guys and make everyone feel like they're part of the group."
