

Pride in your work, in doing the ordinary things extraordinarily, every day is a critical principle to propelling yourself along that successful path. Equally important is SUSTAINING that work ethic, which eventually becomes your "norm" and has a positive impact on those around you.

"Professionalism" is something that, while you may not be able to rattle off its definition, you know it when you see it. You chose to be a part

of the Air Force, something bigger than yourself. Skill, competency, effectiveness and adherence to the core values of the Air Force are all parts of that professional tenant. Professionalism is the thread that keeps the fabric of OUR Air Force together. There's nothing as impressive from my perspective as a SQ/CC than to watch a young Airman take initiative. Hispanic WWII pilot remembered

Master Sgt. Javier Porras 509th Medical Squadron

Oscar Perdomo was born in 1919 to Hispanic parents in El Paso, Texas. His father had been an officer in General Pancho Villa's Division del Norte.

His family moved to Los Angeles, California in the mid-1920s. Perdomo was commissioned a second lieutenant and awarded his pilot wings at Williams Field, Arizona, January 7, 1944.

After serving as a flight instructor, he completed P-47 Thunderbolt training, and was assigned to the 464th Fighter Squadron of the 507th Fighter Group in October 1944, and then deployed to Ie Shima, in the Pacific, in June 1945. Perdomo flew just 11 combat missions before the war ended, and he became the last "ace in a day" of World War II when he destroyed five Japanese aircraft during one mission on August 13, 1945. Perdomo served in the reserves after the war and returned to active duty during his tour in Korea. He left



the Air Force in 1958 as a major.

He passed away in March 1976 at the age of 56.

His Distinguished Service Cross Citation

"First Lt. (Air Corps) Oscar F. Perdomo (ASN: 0-763328), United States Army Air Forces, was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy while serving as Pilot of a P-47 Fighter Airplane in the 464th Fighter Squadron, 507th Fighter Group, Twentieth Air Force, in aerial combat against enemy forces on 13 August 1945, during an air mission near Seoul, Korea. On that date, 1st Lt. Perdomo engaged a superior number of enemy aircraft, shooting down five in this one battle to become an ACE in a day. First Lt. Perdomo's unquestionable valor in aerial combat is in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, the 20th Air Force, and the United States

We will continue to move forward in highlighting key issues with front page links, reducing mouse clicks and making these sites more user friendly, but the bottom line is that the information is out there! Leaders get one chance to tell the Air Force story and must be willing to seek out and demand answers for their Airmen!

Pregnancy and your teeth

Congratulations! You're pregnant! Odds are, if this title has caught your attention, you're probably an expectant mother. If you're not, then I apologize for calling you pregnant, but let's assume for a moment you are in fact, pregnant. As an expectant mother, you've got that "glow" about you, and it is undoubtedly accompanied by a beautiful smile on your face. Or, like many expectant mothers, you are experiencing that glorious trial we call "morning sickness." I'll spare you the details of how that works, as just talking about it may bring up memories you'd rather forget. But, if you've experienced it or are currently experiencing it, you know your tummy isn't happy; and often it will reject perfectly good food. With rejection comes a mouthful of unpleasantness – very acidic unpleasantness. Let's discuss this in greater detail.

Have you ever heard a mother say something along the lines of "pregnancy ruined my teeth," or "when I was pregnant, my child sucked all the calcium from my teeth and now I have a bunch of cavities?" The truth of the matter is it has nothing to do with your unborn bundle of joy, but rather with the morning sickness you experienced during your pregnancy. Here's how it works: you eat a delicious plate of pasta and red sauce. After consuming the pasta, you quickly realize you and your little baby

do not like it - at all. After telling your toilet all about this newly discovered fact, you wonder how to clean out the mess now coating your mouth. You decide to do the logical thing - brush your teeth. Herein lies the issue. You see, this mess that chose to use your mouth as it's personal highway is extremely acidic (pH of about 2 for you chemistry whizzes out there). This acid has just bathed your teeth. Coincidentally, the little bugs in your mouth that cause cavities actually use acid to burrow their way into your pearly-whites. In other words, acid will "soften" the normally hard mineral layer (enamel) that protects your teeth. So, you now have 'soft teeth," and in your haste to get the nastiness out of your mouth, you decide to aggressively brush your teeth. Guess what? That toothbrush, even the "softbristled" one your friendly neighborhood dentist recommended, will actually brush those protective minerals right off. So what you've inadvertently done is gave the acid-loving bacteria in your mouth a wonderful environment to play in, and by brushing your teeth you've effectively opened the proverbial door and invited them to make themselves at

So, what's the best way to handle this situation? I'm glad you asked! Step one: rinse all the yucky stuff out of your mouth with good, old-fashioned water. Water is great because it has no taste to it, and it has no nutrients for that pesky oral bacteria to feed on (yay!). It will readily dilute the acid in your mouth,

and thereby immediately reduce the risk of softening that ever-important enamel. But, damage to your teeth has been done, just by the acid alone. How do you repair it? If you leave your teeth alone, it will usually take about 30 minutes for them to re-mineralize. I recommend doing an additional rinse with something that will assist this hardening process. Milk has a lot of calcium in it, and you may consider it as a rinse. That said, it can easily make an expectant mother nauseous again. If this is the case, then it is not a good choice for you. A great alternative is to find a mouth rinse with fluoride in it. Fluoride is a glorious element that greatly assists your teeth in the hardening process. Swish and spit with a fluoride mouth rinse, and you're doing yourself (and your teeth) a huge

With so many things to consider as an expectant mother, thinking about your teeth is understandably low on your priority list. I hope these simple suggestions I have given will prove themselves to be of use. Small and simple changes in how you manage your teeth can make a tremendous difference in your oral health. 

Deployed Whiteman reservist nominated for Sijan Award

A few months ago, Maj. Chad Carlton was excited as he stood in the deployment line to catch his flight to Afghanistan. Carlton's wing commander, Col. Hubie Hegtvedt, shook hands with each reservist from the 442nd Fighter Wing as they departed, but he paused as he shook Carlton's hand.

"You look too happy to be in this line." Hegtvedt recalled saying to Carlton.

"Sir, deployments like this are the reason I joined the Air Force!" Carlton replied.

The Air Force Reserve recognized Carlton's outstanding leadership and has nominated him to compete for the 2014 Sijan Award. He now moves up for consideration to receive the Air Force-level award.

Carlton, a pilot and weapons officer with the 303rd Fighter Squadron, is currently deployed to Afghanistan and is tasked with improving close air support tactics. He works to overcome challenges unique to the location. For example, the missions often involve Afghans who do not speak fluent English and face a language barrier.

"We are constantly striving to improve close air support while simultaneously keeping Afghan civilians and their

surroundings safe," said Carlton.

His first job pairs an analysis of technical data with the nuanced understanding of the role of a fighter pilot in order to clearly articulate and solve tactical puzzles. His second job is to communicate those solutions.

Carlton's goal is to "better the learning of the squadron and foster open-minded thinkers," he said. "Always instruct through expert execution and honestly address your mistakes."

So far, he has been tremendously successful.

"The Sijan Award is an affirmation of leadership ability," said Hegtvedt. "It's always a pleasure to be able to recognize one of the many talented Airmen from the 442nd Fighter Wing."

The award recognizes Airmen each year who have demonstrated leadership in their personal and professional lives. It is named for the first Air Force Academy graduate, Capt. Lance Sijan, who received the Medal of Honor. Sijan was a pilot who was shot down in Vietnam, evaded capture for 45 days despite several injuries, and died as a prisoner of war.

"The whole reason we train is to be ready to deploy and to be tested in combat," said Carlton. "I am thankful to have the opportunity to be the squadron's weapons officer during a combat deployment."

How to report:

- 1. Call the hotline at 687-SARC (7272) to report a sexual assault, get information, get help getting a forensic exam and/or request a Victim Advocate. You can ask for help anonymously if you choose.
- If your assault happened in the previous 96 hours or less you might want to consider getting a Sexual Assault Forensic Exam (whether you choose Restricted or Unrestricted reporting) to preserve any evidence. Evidence can be stored if you choose not to involve law enforcement immediately.


If getting an exam it is recommended that you do not change clothes, or if you do collect clothing you were wearing at the time of the incident and bring to the exam with you.

- Do not eat or drink anything
- Do not shower, brush your teeth or use mouth-
- Do not take or apply any type of medication to any injuries
- Do not use the bathroom, but if you must, bring urine for testing in a plastic or glass container
- Do not disturb or clean up the crime scene
