Commander's Corner

As many of you know, Monday, December 7th, marked the 74th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. The attack was a tragic and devastating loss for our nation, its military, and thousands of American families.

One of those families belonged to 2nd Lt. George Whiteman – a Sedalia, Mo. native and the namesake for our installation. As the attack began, Lt. Whiteman valiantly attempted to take the fight to the Japanese. He successfully reached his P-40B aircraft and managed to lift off the runway just as a burst of enemy gunfire hit his cockpit. Wounded and unable to control the aircraft, Lt. Whiteman crashed and his plane became engulfed in flames just off the end of the runway.

Earlie Whiteman, Lt. Whiteman's mother, received the tragic news of her son's death at 10:13 p.m. that night. Later on she conducted an interview with the local newspaper and said, "It's hard to believe. It might have happened anytime, anywhere."



That phrase – "anytime, anywhere" – has been adopted by many military units, including our own, as we continue to project lethal combat capabilities "anytime, anywhere" as our service's premiere Total Force Team.

While some of this certainly may not be new information for many of you, I share it as a reminder to us all of the rich history that has

made our wing and our installation what it is today.

Every day most of us see or even say the name "Whiteman," but most of us, including myself, fail to take the time as often as we should to reflect on the service and the sacrifice associated with that name. Unfortunately, we also sometimes fail to adequately remember those who came before us – those brave men and women who paved the way for our success.

By remembering them we not only honor them, but we also remind ourselves of the shared beliefs between us and them. Moreover, their actions should inspire us to continue the tradition of excellence Team Whiteman is known for.

And that's the whole point of our Uphold the Legacy campaign. Upholding the Legacy is not about one person or one moment in time – it's about one shared history, the next chapter of which we are all writing together each day.

Thanks to your continued efforts and the many sacrifices made by our Whiteman families, our next chapter will be just as memorable as the ones that preceded it.

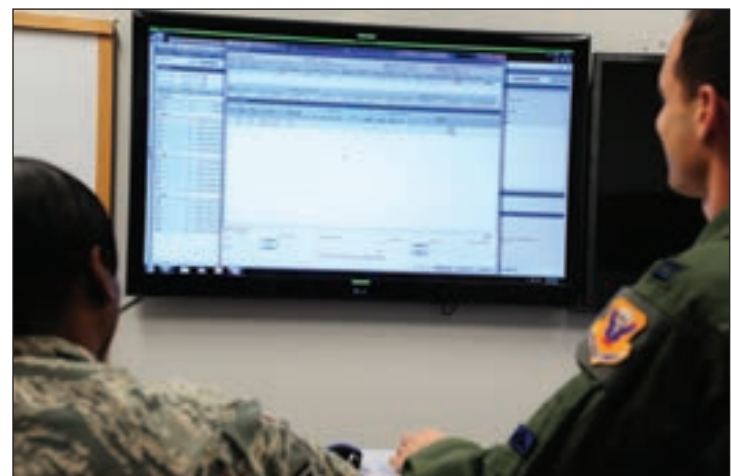
Q. What are your personal goals?

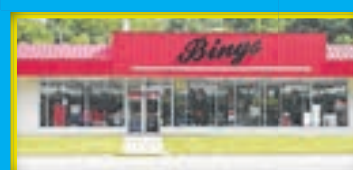

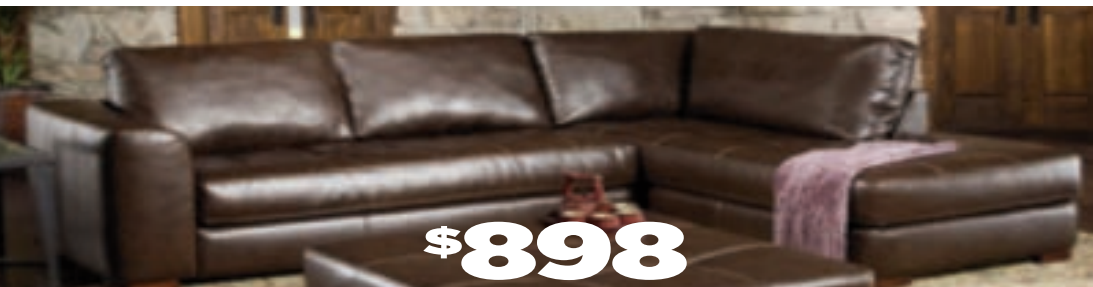

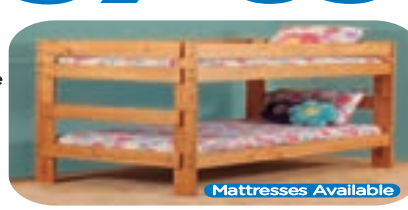

Dirtboyz gear up for the snowfall

It's almost been 40 years since Whiteman Air Force Base, Mo., has seen the highest seasonal snowfall on record of 44.6 inches. When it will happen again, no one knows. However, the "Dirtboyz" at the 509th Civil Engineer Squadron (CES) pavements and heavy equipment shop are prepared to mitigate possible disasters due to inclement weather and enable Whiteman's mission no matter the conditions. Starting around September of every year, the snow removal crew, consisting of 36 pavement and heavy equipment operators, known as the "Dirtboyz," and 28 augmentees from the 509th CES, begin preparing for the snowy winter months. The most important element is

training their personnel on how to properly operate machinery and remove snow. This is accomplished during a two-week snow-removal class. "The class teaches how to maintain equipment, operate equipment and how to properly perform snow-removal operations," said U.S. Air Force Tech. Sgt. Christopher Nelson, the 509th CES NCO in charge of pavements and heavy equipment. "Some Airmen have never seen snow. That's why we focus so much on training our personnel." After the Airmen are trained, they begin to prep equipment to ensure it is fully functional. The shop is equipped with snow brooms, plows, skid steers and different forms of ice-melting compounds. Twenty foot-wide plows, 18 foot-wide snow brooms and a potassium acetate-based deicer are

used to clear the flightline and prevent corrosion. "We check the fluid levels in all of our snow-removal vehicles, the bristles on the snow brushes and make sure that we have enough deicers for both the flightline and the base roads," said U.S. Air Force Senior Airman Glenn Cooley, a 509th CES pavements and heavy equipment operator. When snow hits, the shop personnel and augmentees are divided into two 12-hour shifts, if necessary. They are issued a checklist where routes are prioritized based on mission requirements, such as clearing the runway prior to other routes, said Cooley. "People can't get to work and planes won't take off if there's snow on the ground," said Cooley. "We are the backbone of the mission during the winter."

and their families.”

For Williams, it's a job that means getting familiar with each of the command's nine wings and one of the broadest mission sets in the Air Force. To build some of that familiarity, Williams traveled to F.E. Warren AFB, Wyoming and Malmstrom AFB, Montana. Williams witnessed firsthand how missileers, maintainers and defenders remain ready to execute the mission.

“A lot of northern tier bases are like CONUS isolated remotes,” Williams said. “The biggest take away for me was the comradery and the sense of community that the Airmen on those bases have. Their sense of pride and commitment to the mission set is daunting. They get it done in spite of not having the past comforts that some may have known coming from metropolitan areas. I have 100% confidence in the leadership and ability of the teams that are out there.”

Gaining an understanding helps Williams to advocate for AFGSC Airmen. While observing the day-to-day operations of those who operate, maintain and defend the Minuteman III, the command chief says he has gained more than just a familiarity, but a deep understanding and appreciation for what these Airmen do.

“Our crews work long, long days,” Williams said. “I didn't have that appreciation prior to going out and seeing it firsthand.”

Although he is new to the ICBM field, he is familiar with other aspects of the AFGSC mission and the Airmen who work with aircraft.

“I have a little skin in the game as it relates to the B-1 mission,” added Williams. “I was the 12th Air Force Command Chief at Davis-Monthan ... when two of the wings were Dyess and Ellsworth, so seeing our entire bomber fleet under one command is much like it was in the early days of me coming into the Air Force.”

Williams is impressed with the Airmen -- civilian, enlisted and officer alike - of Global Strike Command. This is largely due to the influence of the Airmen he has met with so far.

“I am thankful for the hospitality, the leadership that exists at the bases that I've visited thus far, as well as the entire command,” Williams said. We welcome the opportunity to provide solutions to challenges and the opportunity to better take care of Airmen and their families. We sleep at ease because they're on watch day in and day out.”
