BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La. -- The combined teamwork of 509th Bomb Wing and the 131st Bomb Wing resulted in Team Whiteman winning the Fairchild Trophy for the Best Bomb Wing as Air Force Global Strike Command officials announced the winners of the third-annual Global Strike Challenge during a score posting event here Nov. 7.

Team Whiteman bested five other bomb wings to take home the Fairchild Trophy, and squeaked out a narrow vic-

tory over second place 7th Bomb Wing, Dyess AFB, Texas, with a final score of 3541 to 3537.

This is the second time the 509th and 131st have earned top honors since the competition began in 2010.

Team Whiteman also brings home the Ellis Giant Sword trophy for the Best Bomber Maintenance Group; and the Best Bomber Nuclear Munitions Maintenance Team award.

The 110th Bomb Squadron earned the Tibbets Trophy for the Best B-2 Squadron, and Staff Sgt. Kyle Douglass, 509th Security Forces Squadron Installation Patrolmen, was named the Best Security Forces M4 Shooter.

Other top honors included the 91st Missile Wing at Minot

AFB, N.D., earning the Blanchard Trophy for the best ICBM Wing; the 54th Helicopter Squadron, Minot AFB, N.D., winning the Bourland Trophy for the Best Helicopter Squadron; and the 91st Security Forces Group, Minot AFB, N.D. taking home the Charlie Fire Team trophy for the Best Security Forces Group.

The score posting event connects the command's heritage and mission, while at the same time recognizing and celebrating the "best of the best" in technical and weapons system expertise in the bomber, missile and security forces areas.

Serve those who served

Many Americans will start a three-day weekend today as we celebrate Veterans Day with a federal holiday, Nov. 11, to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice.

I didn't grow up in a military family, so to be honest, I didn't really understand the meaning of Veteran's Day until I joined the Air Force and met some veterans who enlightened me through their words and actions.

One of the most memorable was Col. Charles McGee, the famed Tuskegee Airman who rose above prejudice and segregation at home to defend our nation in the skies over Europe, eventually setting the Air Force record for the highest number of combat sorties with 409.

I had the incredible honor of commanding a group that included one of the original Tuskegee fighter squadrons, and Col. McGee graciously volunteered to serve as one of our honorary commanders. Listening to his stories of flying escort for B-17s and shooting down a German fighter was a priceless opportunity to share aviation stories with a living legend.

I also had the privilege of spending time with Karl Rothdiener, who was part of the German army that Charles McGee was flying over and fighting against in WWII. Herr Rothdiener was my landlord when we were

stationed in Germany, and paying the rent often turned into a living history lesson as he described battle lines and bunkers and fallen friends from 50 years ago as if they were yesterday.

I will never forget the sense of pride I felt as he described the fair treatment and lifelong admiration for the American values of freedom and justice that he learned as a United States prisoner of war.

I never met one of the veterans who made the biggest impact on me, because he'd already made the ultimate sacrifice before I knew anything about him. Chief Warrant Officer 2 Bryan Nichols was an Army reservist who was killed in action along with 29 other servicemen in a Chinook helicopter crash in Afghanistan in August 2011.

I learned about Warrant Officer Nichols through the words of his widow when I met her at a Reserve Officer's Association banquet. Listening to her story of resilience in honoring Bryan's memory while she forged ahead with her life was an inspiration to me and my family.

These men and women served in different places and even different nations, but they all left me with a rekindled feeling of pride in our country, and reminded me what Veterans Day is really about – honoring the sacrifices of our veterans, learning from their example of service to something greater than themselves, and giving thanks to our veterans and their families for the gift of freedom they've given to our nation.

So this Veterans Day and throughout the

The Whiteman AFB Health and Wellness Center is encouraging tobacco users to join others nationwide and give up tobacco for 24 hours in celebration of the 37th Annual Great American Smokeout Thursday.

Members who bring in half of a pack or more of tobacco product, cigarettes, cigars, pipe tobacco, chew or dip, electronic cigarette supplies to the Health and Wellness Center on Thursday between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. will receive a free "cold turkey" sandwich in return for surrendering the remaining tobacco products that they own prior to that special moment of quitting.

According to the American Lung Association, every year in the U.S. over 392,000 people die from tobacco-caused diseases, making it the leading cause of preventable death. Another 50,000 people die from exposure to second-hand smoke.

Smokers who quit smoking can see benefits of that decision within 20 minutes of their last cigarette.

☐ 20 minutes after quitting: Your heart rate and blood pressure drop.

☐ 12 hours after quitting: The carbon monoxide level in your blood pressure drops to normal.

☐ 2 weeks to 3 months after quitting: Your circulation improves and your lung function increases.



☐ 1 to 9 months after quitting: Coughing and shortness of breath decreases; cilia (tiny hair-like structures that move mucus out of the lungs) start to regain normal function in the lungs, increasing the ability to handle mucus, clean the lungs and reduce the risk of infection.

☐ 1 year after quitting: The excess risk of coronary heart disease is half that of a continuing smoker's.

☐ 5 years after quitting: Risk of cancer of the mouth, throat, esophagus and bladder are cut in half. Cervical cancer risk falls to that of a non-smoker. Stroke risks can fall to that of a non-smoker after 2-5 years.

☐ 10 years after quitting: Risk of dying

from lung cancer is about half that of a person who is still smoking. The risk of cancer of the larynx and pancreas decreases.

☐ 15 years after quitting: The risk of coronary heart disease is that of a non-smoker's.

Earlier this year, the Air Force Instruction governing tobacco use in the Air Force, 40-102, was significantly revised. Very soon, Team Whiteman members and visitors will notice several efforts being made by a working group led by the 509th Civil Engineer Squadron's Asset Management office to improve the health of all who live, work, and play in the confines of Whiteman AFB.

Among these efforts will be the reduction of locations where tobacco may be used, known as Designated Tobacco Areas, or DTAs. Of primary importance to the working group is assisting tobacco users in cessation efforts and minimizing the health risks to others from second hand tobacco smoke exposure.

To assist tobacco users in quitting, the Health and Wellness Center provides onsite classes, and access to online based support or telephone counseling support.

The program emphasizes that quitting tobacco and maintaining abstinence is a learning process where individuals must learn to manage nicotine addiction, unlearn automatic behaviors of smoking and substitute healthy alternatives.

AF officials delay MilPDS upgrade

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas (AFNS) -- Air Force officials are delaying the upgrade of the Military Personnel Data System that was originally scheduled for December.

Delaying the upgrade is necessary to ensure the new system is thoroughly tested by the Air Force Personnel Center and other Department of Defense and Air Force agencies that use personnel information from MilPDS.

"Despite the best efforts of many, we must delay the upgrade," said Robert Corsi, Air Force assistant deputy chief of staff for man-

power, personnel and services. "It's critical we ensure our Airmen have the best possible personnel data system, and to do that we need to complete testing on the new system before we upgrade MilPDS."

The delay will have minimal impact on total force Airmen as personnel processes have been established to allow Airmen to continue to submit early retirement and separation applications until Nov. 16. The personnel processes and programs identified below will revert back to the requirements and timelines outlined in their respective Air Force instructions:

- Scheduling oral proficiency interviews, Defense Language Proficiency Tests for foreign language proficiency bonuses
- Applying for reenlistments and enlistment extensions
- Completing base of preference applications
- Completing in-place base of preference applications
- Applying for voluntary retraining
- Updating Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance policies

MilPDS is the primary records database for personnel data and actions that occur throughout every total force Airman's career. MilPDS is also used to initiate Airman pay actions, maintain Air Force accountability and strength data and support a host of interactions with other Air Force processes and systems that rely on personnel data.

Reserve and Guard members will receive specific instructions from the Air Force Reserve Command and Air Reserve Personnel Center concerning how the delay will impact their personnel programs. More information is available on the ARPC public web site at <http://www.arpc.afrc.af.mil>.

From the Frontlines: Senior Airman Marita McCoy

Heading home after a deployment can be a strenuous task for Airmen, especially when dealing with shipping cargo and weapons back to their home station.

One Airman who helped redeploying Airmen get cargo home is Senior Airman Marita McCoy, 509th Logistics Readiness Squadron in-bound cargo receiving clerk, who recently returned to Whiteman after a six-month deployment.

McCoy was stationed at the 376th Logistics Readiness Squadron Transit Center at Manas, Kyrgyzstan. She served as weapons monitor from Jan. 11, 2012 to July 22, 2012, and dealt with all the weapons that came through the base.

"I worked in the deployment transit center, and packed and shipped weapons for people who were coming from down-range," said McCoy. "We accepted their weapons if they were going to Germany for their R&R."

McCoy inventoried, processed and was accountable for proper transporta-

tion of each service member's weapons returning from places within Southwest Asia.

She was also responsible for Third Party Turn In, which are Joint Expeditionary Tasking Airmen weapons.

"We received a list of names of service members and I picked up the weapons, verified the serial number, did quality control and inspected the cases," McCoy said.

Some weapons McCoy handled were the M-4 Carbine, M-9 Pistol, M240 Machine Guns, 249 light machine and sniper rifles.

"Without me service members would not get their weapons delivered to their home station and would have to transport them back themselves," McCoy said.

A typical day for McCoy included 12-hour shifts, 7-days a week.

"In my spare time I volunteered with the Manas Area Benefit Outreach Society, and helped out the schools in Kyrgyzstan, delivering donated supplies and toys," McCoy said. "We also helped renovate the school building and improve

the school's condition."

McCoy says her favorite part was working at the Women's Crisis Center and interacting as a mentor for abused women.

"We made every effort to help women get back on their feet," McCoy added.

McCoy said the very best part of her deployment was getting to see her family and making new friends.


"I was fortunate to be there with my father, stepmother and 15-year-old brother who live Kyrgyzstan," the St. Louis native said. "My father is retired Air Force who now works there as an air traffic controller instructor and has lived there for more than eight years."

Although she said she was lucky to see members of her family, she missed her mother, Whiteman AFB and the mission here.

"Overall, I loved my first deployment and it opened up my eyes which further strengthened my appreciation of being an American," McCoy said.

Before she left for her deployment,

131st Bomb Wing participates in statewide earthquake exercise

Airmen from the 131st Bomb Wing Medical Group took part in a mass casualty exercise Sunday at Jefferson Barracks National Guard Station in conjunction with Vigilant Guard, a statewide training exercise Nov. 3-7.

In the scenario, much like the real-world earthquake that shook Missouri and surrounding states over 200 years ago, the exercise began with an intense quake

along the New Madrid Seismic Zone, producing significant damage to southeast Missouri counties. Forty-five medical personnel from Whiteman Air Force Base and Jefferson Barracks National Guard Station responded to the mass casualty exercise during the early hours Nov. 4.

"Throughout the day, our medical personnel received valuable, hands-on training, treating patients with a wide range of injuries. We were able to utilize the new triage package, also known as 976K, which has the capability to provide initial life, limb and eye-saving support for up to 100 patients during an initial response phase," said Tech Sgt. Greg Myers, 131st Medical Group Exercise Evaluation Team member.

The equipment used can triage and stabilize patients in immediate and delayed categories for transport to definitive care, or provide first aid for patients in a minimal triage category.

"This was the first time training with the new equipment has been conducted for guard members in the state of Missouri," said Myers. "It was of great benefit to train with it so there are no surprises when there is a real-world emergency."

The exercise also involved state and local authorities from across the area, to include Missouri's State Emergency Management Agency, the Department of Natural Resources, the Disaster Medical Assistance Team, and emergency operation centers in counties throughout Missouri.

"Our training in these exercises is vital to our state mission," said Col. Gregory Champagne, 131st Bomb Wing commander. "We are responsible to not only maintain readiness in the B-2 Spirit mission, but in our state mission as well. This exercise validated our ability to carry out our Citizen Airmen mission should the governor call us into action."

The difference between a successful career and an unsuccessful one is how a service member manages and plans for their future.

In an effort to support those forecasts, members from the 509th Force Support Squadron Career Development Office are available to help connect Team Whiteman to their goals.

“We sustain the number one warfighting machine in the Air Force; which is people,” said Capt. Amanda Patton, 509th FSS Military Personnel Section Chief. “We ensure people are prepared to accomplish the mission.”

The MPS office provides 100 percent customer service to the warfighter to adequately prepare them to complete the mission. Services include promotion retention, re-enlistments, assignments and assisting those transitioning in separations or retirements, according to Senior Master Sgt. David Grisdale, 509th FSS Military Personnel Section superintendent.

“Our team also ensures an Airman’s needs are met when it comes to re-enlistment bonuses, special boards such as force shaping, cross training and are involved in the date of separation rollback program,” Patton said.

The 12-person team is also in charge of the Personal Deployment Function and is tasked during an exercise or real world events.

“We make sure Airmen are combat ready with updated dog tags, records and emergency contacts,” Patton said.

Additionally, the team assists in Causality Augmentation Support Team for search and recovery and is trained to respond

to an incident, according to Patton.

“We notify the Air Force Personnel Center of a member’s condition or circumstance,” Patton said. “We work closely with other base facilities and commanders to ensure a streamlined process is established.”

The one-stop shop is designed to be a smooth process while taking care of customers’ needs to the upmost of our ability so they can focus on the mission, according to Patton.

“While service members are at Whiteman AFB, our office will eventually affect them,” Patton said.

Their job also affects family members, according to Master Sgt. Dawn Couey, 509th FSS Military Personnel Section Career Development supervisor.

“We have each family member to consider as part of the process,” Couey said.

The staff of 12 personnel serves more than 30-40 visitors a day, which does not include the phone calls and emails, according to Couey.

“The busiest time of year is summer because of PCS season – we gain and lose people during this time period – we also train incoming staff,” Patton said.

The team stays busy and makes every effort to accomplish their goals and work toward the next level, according to Grisdale.

CATM range reopens after upgrades

The 509th Security Forces Squadron's Combat Arms Training and Maintenance firing range re-opened Nov. 2, after being closed for six months for safety and sound upgrades.

Planning for the \$2 million project began last year, with actual renovation starting in April 2012.

According to Tech. Sgt. Christopher Camara, the renovations and upgrades were necessary.

"The first step of this project was to install some acoustic baffling to absorb some of the noise," Camara, 509th Security Forces Squadron's Combat Arms NCOIC, said.

Previously, noise levels reached 170db. With the new baffling, the levels were reduced to approximately 120dbs. Other improvements included repouring the range's concrete surface that begun to crack after nearly 10 years of consistent use.

The addition of a new ventilation system allows air to blow from the rear of the range and past shooters so they are not exposed to any lead or other toxins in the air.

The most important aspect of the upgrade was the installation of an \$850,000, start-of-the art bullet trap to collect rounds fired down-range. The previous bullet trap had become a potential risk from show

signs of stress and deterioration.

"We installed an action-target bullet trap to contain all the rounds we fired to make sure that they don't leave the range and hurt anyone," Camara said.

The upgrades didn't lessen Combat Arms team's mission to ensure and maintained 100% weapons training and certification on Whiteman Airmen; the upgrades just provided the team an opportunity to find other training avenues.

"During the upgrades, CATM instructors arranged to transport Airmen to the range at Camp Clark, Missouri to complete firing requirements," Camara said.

Airman 1st Class Jeffery Bowen, CATM student from the 509th Maintenance Squadron, said the CATM made him more comfortable firing an M4.

"I learned a lot in this class about sighting and trigger control. I never really fired guns before because I grew up in the city. I learned a lot in from this CATM course."

Now that the improved range is opened, Camara stated that Combat Arms will begin instruction on new Air Force weapons training and certification requirements.

"We will be starting the new Air Force qualification course which is double the amount of rounds, and it also adds a new element of short-range combat, geared more for personnel deploying overseas."




