4. PURPOSE AND NEED FOR ACTION (Identify decision to be made and need date)

1. State the purpose of this action.

We need to address two critical issues: ongoing HVAC problems and our existing capacity shortfall. Resolving the HVAC issues is essential for maintaining a comfortable and functional environment. Simultaneously, we must tackle the capacity deficit to effectively meet current and future demands. Finding a solution that addresses both challenges is a priority.

2. State the need for this action.

A recent survey concluded that Child Development Centers on a vast number of Air Force installations are inadequately sized to meet the demands of the supporting population.

3. What do you intend to accomplish and why is the action necessary?

Construct a one-story addition onto the existing Child Development Center, Building 3021. Additionally, upgrade the fire detection/mass notification system, and install a new HVAC system for the entire existing facility.

4. What is currently being done to meet the need?

At Whiteman, children are put on a waiting list that ranges between 45 and 80 children. When parents are unable to find childcare on base, they are forced to seek other options. This places an immense amount of stress on the families, considering Whiteman's rural location and limited child care opportunities. The average ratio of children on the waiting list to children in the CDC is 1:2 (i.e. for every two children in the CDC, there is one child on the waiting list).

5. Provide any additional details related to the Purpose and Need for Action.

Whiteman's Child Development Center will continue to be incapable of fully meeting mission requirements. Finding adequate off-base child care will continue to be a major stressor for incoming military personnel. Employees and supervisors will struggle to adjust work schedules so that children and infants can be dropped-off and picked-up from the limited off-base child care establishments.

Construct a one-story addition onto the existing Child Development Center, Building 3021. Additionally, upgrade the fire detection/mass notification system, and install a new HVAC system for the entire existing facility.

2. Describe alternatives to the proposed action.

Status Quo, Upgrade HVAC Only, Add/Alter, Lease, and New Construction.

3. What alternatives were eliminated from consideration and why?

Maintaining the status quo was not viable due to ongoing, unresolved HVAC problems affecting the facility.

Upgrading the HVAC system alone was insufficient to address the underlying capacity deficit, leading to its rejection.

Leasing options were not pursued due to a lack of available and appropriate properties.

New construction was deemed unfeasible due to the significant capital expenditure required and concerns about responsible use of government funds.

4. Describe what will happen if no action is taken.

The ongoing limitations of Whiteman's Child Development Center will continue to hinder the fulfillment of mission requirements. This, coupled with the difficulty in securing sufficient off-base childcare, will remain a significant source of stress for incoming military personnel. Both employees and supervisors will face challenges in adjusting work schedules to accommodate the limited availability and hours of off-base childcare.
