## Whiteman Airmen, B-2s maintain readiness in Guam

ANDERSEN AIR FORCE BASE, Guam -- About 225 Airmen and three B-2 Spirits from Whiteman Air Force Base, Missouri, deployed here Aug. 7 to conduct familiarization training activities in the Indo-Asia-Pacific region.

The goal of the training is to maintain force readiness by conducting flight operations in an environment outside of the United States.

"The objectives I outlined are simple," said Lt. Col. Robert Makros, 13th Bomb Squadron commander. "I want everyone to come back better and more lethal than before they left."

Makros' objectives may be simple, but it's the execution of the mission that will carry this deployment toward and through the finish line

"Everyone understands the role they play in the B-2 global strike mission and what it provides to leadership," Makros said. "The flexibility and ability to strike, at the time and place of leadership's choosing, any target set on the globe with precision, range, stealth and a massive payload, conventional or nuclear, is what makes this aircraft incredible."

Makros also said the 13th Bomber Squadron will be training with sister services and other joint aircraft while capitalizing on multi-national training events.

Executing the mission provides flexibility to Air Force Global Strike Command senior leadership, making the B-2 a credible and viable option that delivers decisive effects around the globe.

AFGSC routinely evaluates their readiness and reposition of forces as needed to ensure they maintain both the operational and support capabilities essential to meet training needs -- this includes planned deployments, such as this one, to various regions around

the globe, providing commanders of major commands and combatant commands a global strike capability and extended deterrence against potential adversaries.

"It's why we signed up and what we train for every day," Makros said. "Our aircrew and the entire B-2 team constantly push themselves to be the best because they understand being the best is a must when it comes to generating and flying 30-hour missions, and successfully striking targets half way around the globe."

The familiarization training will not only

be conducted by B-2 aircrews but also by the maintainers and support personnel on the ground.

"Maintainers, cops, support staff -- everyone is receiving great training while deployed here," said Master Sgt. Daryl Allen, 2nd Aircraft Maintenance Squadron first sergeant. "We all face obstacles and new training scenarios that aren't always present stateside, and we have to be ready to fix the aircraft, prepare the aircrew and get it in the sky as quickly and efficiently as possible; that comes from everyone working together."

Wood, Missouri, recognized the large role that the state has played in the defense of our nation.

"Missouri's own sons and daughters have gone into harm's way, some of which have never come home," Raymer said. "We honor their sacrifice, mourn their loss and celebrate their lives."

Brig. Gen. Paul Tibbets IV, 509th Bomb Wing commander and grandson of then-Col. Paul Tibbets Jr., who piloted the Enola Gay as it dropped the first atomic bomb on Hiroshima, Japan, in World War II, also attended the ceremony. In his remarks, he expressed thanks to the community for the tremendous support that nearby Whiteman Air Force Base receives throughout the year.

"I charge you with upholding the legacy of the greatest generation, those men and women in your communities that had so little yet gave so much in support of our military," Tibbets said. "I know my grandfather and the members in his command were eternally grateful for that support and we must ensure it continues, as the success of our nation depends on it."

Danner, Missouri National Guard adjutant general, said that he was honored to be at the "best state fair in the country."

Danner spoke about the Missouri National Guard's Youth Challenge program, which helps disadvantaged youth gain a high school diploma, and a fresh start. Danner said that it is rare that the military has a chance to give back to a community to whom it owes such a debt,

but that Missouri Gov. Jay Nixon has made it possible with this program.

"Anyone who has ever worked on a farm knows if you plant a seed, walk away and hope really hard, all you've done is buried that seed," Danner said. "On the other hand, if you nurture your seeds, invest energy into helping them grow and make some hard sacrifices, you'll have a crop that can feed your family and secure your future."

Dale Mitchell, a World War II Veteran and former prisoner of war, received a standing ovation when he took the stage to address the arena as the ceremony's keynote speaker. The crowd, including more than 30 of Mitchell's family members, listened to the story of how a Missouri farm boy found himself as a crewmember aboard a B-17 Flying Fortress and was ultimately shot down over Vienna, Austria.

Mitchell concluded his story by telling the crowd that he does not consider himself a hero, because he got to come home. He got to marry his high school sweetheart and take advantage of all the opportunities that this great nation affords he said

"The boys that paid the supreme sacrifice – those are the heroes," Mitchell said. "I gave two and a half years of my life for my country, that's all I did."

The ceremony concluded with a salute to Mitchell and to all the military members and families in attendance from more than 175 members of the Patriot Guard Riders motorcycle club.



## Special duties: The key to career advancement

There are an abundance of opportunities that come with being an enlisted member of the United States Air Force.

Whether those prospects are sought out in pursuit of career development, improving skills or opening up options for the future, in the end, the experience gained is important to developing well-rounded leaders.

Airmen fresh out of basic military training soon learn that doors open with a little diligence and foresight. As Airmen progress through the ranks, even more opportunities become available for professional development.

Through the Air Force's Developmental Special Duty Assignment program (DSD), eligible Airmen can serve in a position that allows them to gain experience outside of their primary career field, while mentoring the next generation of Airman leaders.

"Most Airmen look for an opportunity to work in a professional development environment outside their normal Air Force Specialty Code," said Master Sgt. John De La Rosa, 509th Force Support Squadron career assistance advisor. "Others look for self-development and career enhancement. All Airmen should seek the opportunity to fill a DSD assignment at least once in their career. Overall, it's rewarding and will provide a wide perspective about the Air Force and its Airmen."

No matter where you are in your career, there is always room to expand on leadership techniques. With a special duty assignment, an Airman can serve a four-year period in a position that prepares them to one day hold even greater responsibilities. Airmen should also keep in mind that, based on the needs of the Air Force, their tour of duty may be extended beyond that time frame.

"Airmen stand to gain a lot from filling a DSD assignment," said De La Rosa. "For most, they learn about themselves in a different way by being in a different environment.

"They will learn their strengths as well as their weaknesses," added De La Rosa. "They will learn new ways to lead, inspire, motivate and develop, in addition to a new level of understanding about what being an Airman really means. It's no longer about the 'nuts and bolts' of the job, it's about people developing and taking care of people."

Staff sergeants, technical sergeants and master sergeants must adhere to high

standards in order to be considered for nomination. A few of these qualifications include past enlisted performance reports, physical training scores, rank, a Community College of the Air Force degree, and even restrictions on height.

"The Air Force is looking for individuals that represent Air Force core values and discipline," said De La Rosa. "They are looking for someone who possesses character and has the desire to develop Airmen and their families through mentorship and leadership."

Some of the positions eligible Airmen can look into include: career assistance advisor, military training instructor, military training leader, U.S. Air Force Academy Military Training non-commissioned officer (NCO), Airman and Family Readiness NCO, first sergeant, U.S. Air Force Honor Guard NCO, recruiter, professional military education instructor and Air Force specialty training instructor.

When considering being nominated, Airmen should look at what they have to offer and if they embody what it takes to lead others.

"Airmen who want to stand out should be a servant leader; ones whose actions, decisions and behavior is a reflection of that person's character and professionalism," said De La Rosa. "Commanders are looking to nominate individuals that cultivate the virtues of decency, fairness, honesty, humility, integrity and valor through the member's actions."

As with many programs, a lot of knowledge comes from word of mouth. However, some information can get lost in translation, and Airmen could develop misunderstandings.

"The common misconception about the process is that some Airmen think they are prepared for a particular DSD," said De La Rosa. "While most possess some experiences that will help them in their DSD assignment, all the special duties provide a rich experience that will develop them to be a better follower, leader and mentor upon completion. The focus of these special duties is not just about people taking care of people, but also to enhance a member's knowledge and further career growth.

"The other misconception Airmen have concerns the difference between being submitted and being selected for a DSD, which may cause frustration with the system when not selected," said De La Rosa. "DSD is a

## Enlisted to Medical Degree Preparatory Program intent to apply due Oct. 2

**JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas** (AFNS) -- Eligible active-duty enlisted Airmen interested in pursuing a medical degree must submit their intent to apply emails to the Air Force Personnel Center no later than Oct. 2.

The Enlisted to Medical Degree Preparatory Program offers active-duty enlisted members an opportunity to complete the preparatory coursework for admission to medical school while maintaining active-duty status and full pay and benefits. The program, which incurs a three-year active-duty service commitment, will include coursework in a traditional classroom setting with structured prehealth advising and formal medical college admission test preparation, with classes slated to begin August 2016.

Airmen selected for the program will transfer on permanent change of station orders to Bethesda, Maryland, where they will attend school full time at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences.

Following successful completion of the 24-month program, graduates will apply for acceptance to the USUHS medical school and/or civilian medical schools. Once accepted for an approved medical school, participants will be commissioned as second lieutenants in the Medical Service Corps. As fourth-year medical students, those lieutenants will be eligible to apply for medical residencies approved by the Air Force Health Professions Education Requirements Board

The program is open to active-duty enlisted members from all Air Force specialty codes who meet eligibility criteria. Applicants must be younger than 33 as of June 30, 2016, have at least 36 months but no more than 10 years of time-in-service as of Sept. 30, 2015, and have a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree in any discipline from an accredited institution. For more information about the criteria, go to the myPers Enlisted to Medical Degree Preparatory Program page.

Applicants who meet all eligibility criteria must email are intent to apply statement to the Physician Education Branch by Oct. 2. Applicants will be notified by Oct. 23 whether or not they have been released from their career field to compete for selection. Once notified of their eligibility, Airment must submit their application for the Enlisted to Medical Degree Preparatory Program by Dec. 4.

repetitive process much like the assignment system. Airmen who were not selected for DSD in the previous cycles will be nominated during the subsequent cycles to come."

By being proactive, service members who one day plan on holding a special duty assignment can focus on becoming a better candidate. On the other hand, service members who think they are eligible for a DSD are highly encouraged to look into the resources offered on base.

The career assistance advisor is hosting a developmental special duty panel made up of some of Whiteman's finest to share their special duty experiences Sept. 8, 2015 from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m., at the Ford Auditorium in the Professional Development Center.

There, expert information about all 10 career fields will be discussed to help prepare Airmen to take on such challenging and rewarding opportunities.

Supervisors, flight commanders and squadron commanders are also encouraged to attend, as they are a vital part of

- 3. Choose which course you wish to attend by clicking the on the left side of the course description, and follow the registration directions.


