Remembering our American heroes

Over 70 years ago, Airmen were chosen for a highly secretive assignment that would be remembered long after the end of World War II (WWII).

Commanded by Lt. Col. Paul Tibbets Jr., they were known as the 509th Composite Group (CG) and were to be based in Wendover Army Air Field, Utah to conduct the majority of their training. Their mission was to plan for and execute the dropping of the first atomic bombs.

All the preparation spent stateside and abroad would eventually lead to the successful detonation of the atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Japan, which effectively ended the war in August 1945.

Although the mission would transfer to other locations over the course of five decades, the heritage of the 509th CG never faded. Veterans reunited with the grandson of the 509th CG commander, Brig. Gen. Paul Tibbets IV, 509th Bomb Wing (BW) commander, during a historical weekend and were able to see how the 509th BW continues to carry their tradition of excellence today.

The remaining survivors of the 509th CG returned to where it all began for their final reunion September 24-27, 2015, at Wendover, Utah.

The veterans were welcomed 'home' to Wendover Field where they were able to see the restoration of many of the base's facilities and displays.

After remarks from retired General Bruce Carlton, former 8th Air Force commander, on the capabilities and achievements of the B-29 Superfortress aircraft, a 12-piece swing band provided WWII era 'big band' music for the veterans, families and guests.

The following day, veterans and guest gathered for the 70th commemoration of the end of WWII.

"With more than eight World War II craft radio operator

era aircraft on hand, along with several re-enactors, the crowd got a strong representation of what life at a World War II training base was really like," said Thomas Peterson, Wendover Air Field Museum historian. "Base tours allowed veterans and guests to view many parts of the base including the barracks, enlisted mess hall, B-29 hangar and the atomic bomb loading pit. As part of the reunion events, several people were able to try their hand at firing a period M-1 Garand rifle."

The overall atmosphere was very much like a homecoming event; many people said it was quite moving to be in the exact place where more than 70 years ago their grandfathers had been, added Peterson.

As the event's keynote speaker, Tibbets IV was able to provide a glimpse into his command and what the heritage of the 509th means to him. He also had the opportunity to meet with many of the families of veterans who served under his grandfather and shared recollections and stories of their 509th heritage.

"It was a truly remarkable experience to spend time with some of the Airmen who laid the foundation of excellence for 509ers today," said Tibbets IV. "As they shared their stories with me throughout the weekend, I was humbly reminded of the character of the people that my grandfather so affectionately spoke. Those very Airmen set the bar high for us, and we must continue to carry that torch, solidifying the framework on which future 509ers will continue our mission."

Peterson reflected on the long legacy of the 509th.

"I am impressed mostly by the determination of these veterans," said Peterson. "They were from all walks of life and had so many levels of training. The important thing was that they were then and still are dedicated to the freedoms that we all hold dear. They were asked to do a job, a very special job, and they did it with excellence.

"As we give tours of the base we often tell how the course of history was changed and that change started here. As the poem 'Flanders Fields' says, they 'took the torch and held it high'. Coming to Wendover 71 years later was a fitting bookend for these 509th veterans."

Whiteman Hot Topics

Every week we'll address concerns expressed by the Whiteman community.

With winter almost upon us, why has another year passed without an indoor track being built? Why couldn't we use non-appropriated funds to build the (indoor) track?

Answer: Fitness facilities, including an indoor track or an artificial turf field, must be paid for by taxpayer dollars that Congress authorizes, the same way Congress authorizes our pay, equipment, training, etc. Construction of a new indoor track is included with a Military Construction (MILCON) project request that would nearly double the size of the existing Fitness Center. MILCON projects are specifically authorized by Congress, and Whiteman receives on average one new project approximately every three or four years. We have completed a pre-design for the new fitness center that includes an indoor track. An approval timeline for this MILCON project cannot be forecasted at this time. We understand the desire for an indoor track and will continue to advocate for the Fitness Center MILCON project.

Don't you think a new gym would have been more logical than a bowling alley?

Answer: The Bowling Alley is being constructed with Non-Appropriated Funds (NAF), a completely separate funding stream than traditional Military Construction (MILCON) dollars. Construction of the Bowling Alley has no influence or impact on the future construction of a new Fitness Center. NAF funds are generated directly from the community (purchasing coffee at Mission's End, lunch at the bowling center, etc.). The Bowling Center is an integral part of the recreational activities available at Whiteman AFB. The new Bowling Center will be a significant upgrade over the current facility, and it will be able to generate NAF funds which are utilized to benefit the local base community. These funds are given back to our Whiteman community by way of programs, equipment and facility upgrades, renovations and projects. We are fortunate to be able to offer this family-friendly recreational facility and to contribute towards the quality of life here at Whiteman AFB.

Beat the Boss

The Beat the Boss program is a monthly PT test competition between 509th units that will recognize outstanding teamwork and devotion to fitness at the Squadron level. Active duty 509th Airmen who score the same or higher than the commander's score of 96.3% will earn a one-day pass and those who score a 100% win a one-day pass and one of the commander's coins.







ne voice of the victims

Alaska (AFNS) -- Power: the strength to make a decision. Control: the means to carry it out. These things are the currency of freedom, and what are robbed from sexual assault victims.

"A lot of people think sexual assault is about sex," said Capt. Jonathan Henley, a member of the Special Victims' Counsel at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson. "But it's not; it's about power and control."

So what can a victim do when power and control of their body has been taken away, when their voice has been silenced?

There's a plethora of resources, each with their own unique role and the SVC is one of them.

In January 2013, the Air Force became the first U.S. military service to institute an SVC program. The driving force behind the program was Lt. Gen. Richard Harding, then-judge advocate general of the Air Force.

"Before the SVC program was created, two of the main players in the court process had an attorney representing them -- the accused had an attorney or two representing them and the government had an attorney or two representing the government's interests," said Capt. Jennifer Lake, a member of the Area Defense Counsel at Eglin Air Force Base, Florida, and first SVC at JBER. "But, then you had this other person who was going through this process, who had no idea what's going on in the legal world and has rights, but had not been provided with an attorney to defend those rights or to advocate for them and what they want."

While support for the victim was there, many felt that support could be fortified.

"So Lieutenant General Harding came up with the idea of appointing an attorney to represent the victim and what the victim wants," Lake said. "This way, the victim's voice can be heard throughout the process."

So what does an SVC actually do?

As it turns out, the answer is not nearly as simple as the question. The SVC does a lot of things, and their role largely depends on the unique needs of the particular client.

"I have an attorney-client relationship with the victim," Henley said. "If they're telling me what they would like to see out of it; then my marching orders are to advocate for those desires and their rights."

Sometimes that even means not seeking a conviction.

When reporting sexual assault, there are two paths one can take. They can choose to file a restricted report or an unrestricted report. The SVC can help with either case; however, the capacity they serve in depends on the type of case the victim has filed.

The main difference between the two is that an unrestricted report may spark a legal investigation process, whereas a restricted report does not.

In both cases, privacy and confidentiality are given a high priority.

"The victims have a right to privacy," Henley said. "That is paramount to any discussion regardless of the type of report being used."

If one wanted to file a restricted report with the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response office, they have the option to request legal advice from an SVC, even before filing the report.

"If a victim comes to me and says, 'I want to make a restricted report," Henley said. "I will go with them to the SAPR office to make that report and be by their side the entire time."

By doing so, the SVC is giving the reporter the power to make a well-informed decision when deciding whether or not to go unrestricted with their report.

"My role as an SVC (in a restricted report) was to answer questions for that person, clarify any concerns they may have, and help them understand what the legal process is, should they choose to go unrestricted," Lake said. "When someone goes restricted and they want an SVC, it's typically because they want to know what happens if they go unrestricted."

In an unrestricted report, the SVC serves as the victim's attorney throughout the military justice process. This relationship is completely voluntary; a reporter of sexual assault can choose not to be represented by an SVC or decide they want an SVC at any time during the reporting process, Lake said.

"At any point in time throughout the process, even two days before trial, someone could say, 'I'm getting a little nervous; I think I actually do want a lawyer, get me an SVC," Lake said. "Then they'll go through that process to get an SVC."

Throughout the entire reporting process, the victim should be informed of the benefits an SVC can provide them and advised on how to procure an SVC's assistance. However, SVCs cannot solicit cases, so they will not come to the victim, the victim must reach out to them.

"One big concern for victims is a loss of control," Henley said. "Coming forward is the first step to taking that control back -- I can't help but be proud of them."

The SVC is one way the Air Force continues to refine itself so every Airman, civilian employee and family member is equipped by their inalienable rights for a fair justice system.

"I think it's important for everyone to understand the SVC program; and giving victims a voice doesn't mean the victim's voice is what should control everything that goes on," Lake said. "It just means they get their say too.

"It's important that everybody's rights are protected and everybody is represented. Everyone should get to be heard, and then we make a decision."

Talking to an SVC may be a victim's first step toward taking back their power.

"They do have a voice, they have the power to make decisions and take back the control that was taken from them," Henley said. "My goal is, that through me, their voice can be heard."


