

VA assists transitioning service members preparing for 21st century job market

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) new VA benefits I and II briefings are now available at Whiteman Air Force Base, Mo., as part of the redesigned Transition Assistance Program (TAP). The goal of the redesigned TAP is to provide transitioning service members with a set of value-added, individually tailored training programs and services to equip them with the set of tools they need to pursue their post-military goals successfully.

Service members participating in the new VA benefits I and II briefings will experience interactive activities teaching them how to review, apply for, and receive the benefits and services they have earned

The VA's benefits I briefing provides detailed information on education, health care, compensation, life insurance, home loans and other VA benefits and services. During VA benefits II, supplementary information to expand and reinforce what is covered in VA Benefits I, an overview of the disability compensation process, and an introduction to the eBenefits portal (VA's web-based benefits application system) is provided. Both briefings are highly interactive and include practical exercises, videos of personal experiences, and a question and answer session. VA benefits I and II briefings are offered once a month on Tuesdays from 8 a.m. - 3 p.m. For more information on attending, please contact the Airman and Family Readiness Center (AFRC) at (660)-687-7132.

Additionally, advisors conducting VA benefits I and II briefings are available for appointments outside the classroom to assist all service members, veterans, and family members who have questions about VA benefits and services they may be eligible to receive. 

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

Meet U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Mathew Meron, a 509th Security Forces desk sergeant. As a desk sergeant, Meron is responsible for dispatching Whiteman defenders to any type of emergency happening on base such as medical emergencies, assaults or traffic accidents.

Hailing from Allentown, Pennsylvania, Meron has been in the Air Force for nine years and has been stationed at two different duty stations, Whiteman Air Force Base, Mo., and Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska.

Meron's interest for going into law enforcement came from his father.

"My father was my inspiration," said Meron. "He was a military policeman in the Marines and I just kind of chose to follow in his footsteps."

Meron enjoys that his job is not monotonous, and brings a new challenge every day.

"My favorite thing about this job is that nothing is the same every day," said Meron. "Nothing is always black and white. There are a lot of grey areas so you really have to use background knowledge to get the information right and make the right decisions."

Meron's solid performance has earned high praise from those who work with him.

"For a recent accident investigation he worked on his days off to make sure the investigation was accurate and complete," said Master Sgt. Joseph Lindley, 509th SFS flight chief. "He is a great supervisor because he is always looking out for his Airmen. He gives it his all to make sure the mission gets done."

Tricare for ACA requirements

The Affordable Care Act (ACA), which was signed into law, March 23, 2010, requires all U.S. citizens and legal residents to obtain and to maintain a minimum standard of health care insurance. For 2015, taxpayers are required to prove that they have obtained the minimum essential coverage; TRICARE qualifies for this coverage.

Your proof of coverage is the Department of Treasury Internal Revenue Service Form 1095: Employer Provided Health Insurance Offer and Coverage. This form is accessible via MyPay under Taxes.

Each member of our Air Force team (active duty, Air National Guard, Air Force Reserve, retiree and civilian) will need to have his or her IRS Form 1095 to file his or her taxes in 2016.

According to the Health & Safety Authority, the main hazards associated with electricity are:

- Contact with live parts causing shock and burns
- Faults which could cause fires (exposed wires, plugs not fully seated in outlets, etc.)
- Fire or explosion where electricity could be a source of ignition in a flammable or explosive atmosphere



Electrical Hazard Protections

Personal Protective Equipment

- Use, store and maintain your electrical PPE in a safe, reliable condition.
- Wear nonconductive head protection wherever there is a danger of head injury from electric shock or burns due to contact with exposed energized parts.
- Wear protective equipment for the eyes or face wherever there is danger of injury to the eyes or face from electric arcs or flashes or from flying objects resulting from electrical explosion.
