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## THREE TYPES OF SEXUAL ASSAULT REPORTS

### 1. RESTRICTED:

Disclosure of a sexual assault kept **confidential** if made to the SARC, Sexual Assault Victim Advocate, medical personnel (who then notifies the SARC) or chaplain. Person can seek care without triggering an investigation.

### 2. UNRESTRICTED:

Disclosure to OSI, Security Forces, EO, a commander or anyone in person's chain of command triggers an investigation.

### 3. INDEPENDENT:

Person may lose restricted reporting option if they make a disclosure of sexual assault to someone & that person or a bystander reports assault to OSI, security forces or chain of command.

## HOW TO REPORT:

1. Call the hotline at **687-SARC (7272)** to report a sexual assault, get information about restricted/unrestricted reporting options and resources and/or to request a **Victim Advocate**.

***(You can remain anonymous)***

2. A report can be made **in person** at the SAPR office located in the Silverplate Center, 750 Arnold Ave, Bldg 527.

3. If the assault happened within the last 96 hours, a Sexual Assault Forensic Exam can be requested in both Restricted and Unrestricted reporting options. If so:

- *It is recommended you do not change clothes if still wearing from the incident, or do save clothing if changed since time of the incident*
- *Do not eat or drink anything*
- *Do not shower, brush your teeth or use mouth-wash*
- *Do not take or apply any type of medication to any injuries*
- *Do not use the bathroom, but if you must, bring urine for testing in a plastic or glass container*
- *Do not disturb or clean up the crime scene*
