The 2019 Wings Over Whiteman Air and Space Show and Open House is slated for 9 a.m. – 4 p.m., June 15 and 16 at Whiteman Air Force Base, Missouri. Admittance and parking are free.

This year's show includes the F-22s, the A-10s and the U.S. Army Golden Knights Parachute Team, along with Whiteman AFB's B-2 Stealth bomber – celebrating its 30th year in flight. Additionally, there will be dozens of aircraft static displays, vintage and modern war birds, the U.S. Air Force Heartland of America band, vendors, a kids' area and much more.

The nearby Knob Noster State Park offers basic and electric campsites, family campsites, two organized group camps and special-use camping areas. National Guard, joint chief observes total force integration

The National Guard's senior federal officer stopped by Whiteman Air Force Base April 12 to see firsthand the total force integration model between the Air Force's 509th Bomb Wing and the Missouri Air National Guard's 131st Bomb Wing.

Air Force Gen. Joseph L. Lengyel, the 28th Chief of the National Guard Bureau and member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, met with leaders from both wings to gain a greater understanding of Whiteman's commitment to its strategic deterrence mission as the only operators of the Air Force's B-2 Spirit fleet of long-range bombers.

The Guard general was provided a one-stop shop of the Total Air Force, meeting with active duty, Air National Guardsmen, Air Force Reservist and Air Force civilians who comprise Team Whiteman.

"When Gen. Lengyel's team reach out originally, they said he wanted to see total force integration," said Col. Ken Eaves, 131st Bomb Wing commander. "Not only was he able to see TFI, he was able to see one of the best TFIs in the Air Force. And, after his visit, he agreed."

In the Air Force, there are a few things you cannot do alone. It takes a team to accomplish Air Force missions. From dominating in air and space, defending multiple geographical regions to ensuring rapid global mobility and delivering global strike anywhere in the world.

Lengyel's visit took him to out of the way places on base, including the low-observable shop, where a team of Airmen ensure the B-2's exterior is always ready for any mission.

"Our shop did a great job of showcasing TFI to Gen. Lengyel," said Master Sgt. Ryan Kearfott, a signature diagnostics technician

with the 131st Maintenance Squadron. "We had representation from the Guard, active duty and civilians at all levels, from maintainer through production manager. The team explained how they work together every day to accomplish the mission."

"Each entity is governed by slightly different rules and laws, and therefore has to leverage the strengths of each entity in different ways," Kearfott said.

It all comes down the teamwork and a commitment to the broader partnership.

"We were pleased to welcome Gen. Lengyel to Whiteman and highlight our partnership with the 131st," said Brig. Gen. John Nichols, commander of the 509th Bomb Wing. "Our TFI partnership is the gold standard in the United States Air Force."

TFI aims to improve the Air Force's ability to conduct its mission through the sharing of resources between the active duty and the reserve components, including aircraft, crews, maintenance and support.

"Team Whiteman continues to knock it out of the park and the message has now been delivered to our Joint Chiefs," Eaves said.

All Airmen are committed to serving the nation and have to balance their family life with their military career. National Guard Airmen have the added challenge of maintaining that balance with a civilian career and being prepared to support the state during times of emergency. Through it all, Guard Airmen are trained to meet the Air Force standard to accomplish their federal missions.

"There is only one standard of readiness in fighting America's wars," Lengyel said. "This readiness requires the National Guard to be deployable, sustainable and interoperable with our active components."

April is Sexual Assault Awareness, Prevention month

This is the month established to highlight and promote awareness events and stand and support survivors of sexual assault. As caring Wingmen, we must be ready and willing to intervene to assist and support those in our Air Force family, including civilians and dependents, who have been impacted by sexual assault. It is important to practice awareness and prevention efforts every day of the year to ensure we are fostering a culture of dignity and respect where every Airman is safe, valued and empowered to perform their duties ensuring mission success. The Sexual Assault Prevention & Response office stands ready to provide victim-centered response, resource referral and advocacy to members of the Whiteman community. Although, we educate and promote prevention efforts through trainings and briefings, preventing sexual assault falls to each of us as individuals to be willing, active bystanders. We see a culture change focused on prevention only when we are willing to intervene by speaking

up, seeing something and saying something, to stop behaviors and actions that create toxic climates and do not align with our core values or promote dignity and respect. Through "Green Dot" training received the past several years, we have been equipped with tools to empower us to intervene and have also been encouraged that each of us can make small changes that can result in huge impacts. We also must continue to uphold an environment where victims of sexual assault feel safe and supported to disclose

and report, whether the report be restricted or unrestricted. One way this support has been evident is through the delivery of SAPR commander talking points introduced three years ago. Members have come forward to report because they trusted their commanders when told they would be believed and supported, their privacy respected and were encouraged to receive help and advocacy. A positive culture shift is occurring and will continue if we remain willing to intervene both for prevention, response and support.

F-15C Eagles “take the cable” when CE tests emergency arresting system

KINGSLEY FIELD, Ore.— A 173rd Fighter Wing F-15 Eagle drops into the pattern over Kingsley Field making its final approach in what promises to be a very dramatic and unusual landing, March 7, 2019.

This aircraft is performing a test of the system designed to help a damaged aircraft make a safe landing, a critical emergency system called a barrier arrestor. The very first indicator that anything is amiss is the tail hook extended toward the ground, extending below the landing gear wheels, as the aircraft settles toward the surface.

It's rare to see an F-15C with a tail hook like a Navy aircraft, but today it descended—tail hook deployed—and after touching down caught the arresting cable and came to a very rapid stop.

“He hit it at 138 knots, his weight was 32,500 lbs. and we stopped him in 971 feet,” said Staff Sgt. Eduardo Calderon, who is the sole certifier at Kingsley Field for barrier arresting system. He adds that it is exactly what the system is designed to do, and that it could withstand far greater forces than that, repeatedly.

The basic set up consists of a cable attached at either end with a flat nylon webbing “tape”, which is wound onto large, metal drums housed in underground, bunker-like rooms located on either side of the runway. When the cable is engaged these drums function as brakes allowing the cable to spool out, slowing the aircraft, but not so quickly as to injure the pilot or damage the airframe.

“When the system hasn't been engaged in 12 months we conduct an engagement,” said Calderon. “What we are looking for is that both units are very close to each other, they should allow the nylon webbing tape to play out at a nearly identical rate.”

Other parts of the system include a system that raises the cable just above the runway surface when an aircraft is making an emergency landing and two four-cylinder gas motors needed to retract the cable following its use.

He went on to say that this engagement was unusual.

“Typically a certification engagement happens with the aircraft on the ground, but the way he took it was just like a real-world scenario, right after he touched down,” said Calderon. “You don't get to experience that very often.”

After the engagement he and a group of firefighters, who also fall under 173rd Civil Engineering Squadron, reset the system for the next engagement. It may be a year away when the next test is due, but if it's before that in an actual emergency Calderon has ensured the system is ready.

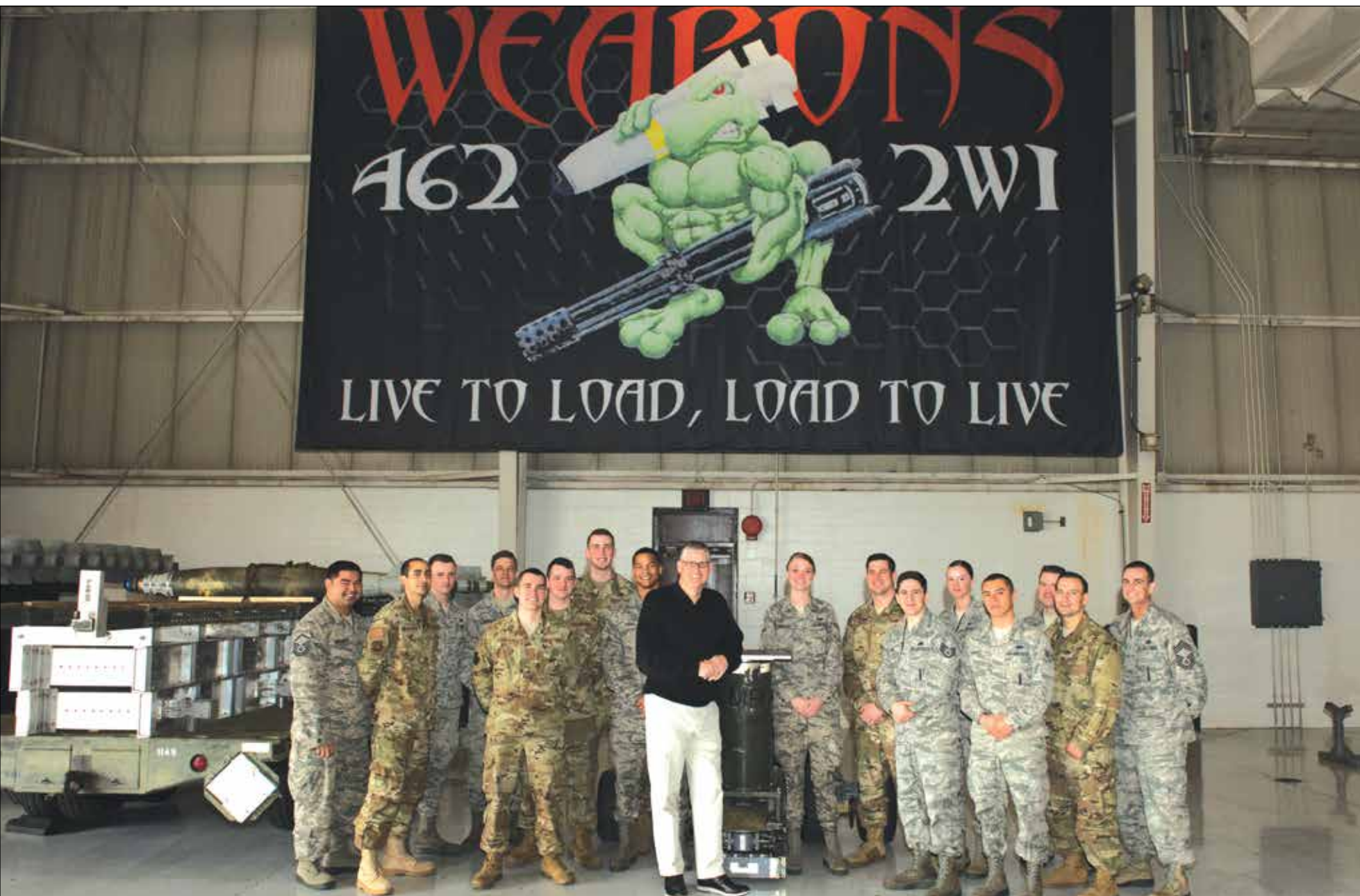


