FISHERY BALANCED AT BASE LAKES

Weekly commander's message

Greetings, Team Whiteman!

This week we were privileged to host the Secretary of the Air Force (SECAF), the Honorable Deborah Lee James, here at Whiteman. During her visit, leadership from our Total Force team had the opportunity to brief the SECAF on some of the recent successful operations we executed, including how we once again proved our vital deterrence capabilities during Exercise Global Thunder 17. Secretary James was thrilled to meet with many of you during the "All Call" and in small group sessions. She consistently relayed how impressed she was with the professionalism and the expertise of our team... which was no surprise to me!

Also during her visit, the SECAF had the exceptional experience of flying in a B-2...she is now Spirit #631! This training sortie provided her a unique, firsthand perspective on our strategic mission, and it was a great opportunity for us to demonstrate our unrivaled global strike capabilities to one of the top senior leaders in the Department of Defense. Thanks to everyone who made her visit such a success...you clearly demonstrated to Secretary James the Legacy of Excellence we are known for!

Even with the SECAF visit, operations continued across the installation. We flew a variety of sorties training our crews across the spectrum of global strike operations. These operations included live Mk-82 weapon releases at the Utah Test and Training Range. Our team supported SMOKEX as well, which is a USAF Weapons School large force employment exercise at the Smoky Hill Range in Kansas.

Furthermore, our logistics professionals assisted the 442d FW with their deployment to Nellis AFB, NV, where they will participate in a two-week live fire exercise. To enable this training, our LRS teammates and 442d FW personnel loaded 25.3 tons of cargo and 31 service members on a C-5. Additionally, 128 personnel were processed and departed on a C-17 to support this exercise... job well done!

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service visited Whiteman to deliver large-mouth bass and fathead minnows to base lakes this week as well. In total, our base lakes were stocked with 2,000 bass and around 20,000 minnows. Additionally, Yellow Perch were stocked in each lake on base, so our lakes are now full for our fishermen to enjoy!

As we move closer to the weekend, Chief Smith and I are looking forward to spending time with many of you during Whiteman Day at Mizzou on Saturday! This event, which is made possible by Mr. Joe Scallorns and our community partners, will be great family-



fun. We will provide a B-2 flyover prior to the game, and hopefully we all will see a win for the Tigers!

Finally, remember this long weekend to pay tribute to America's greatest treasure – our veterans. It is an incredible privilege to be an American and we only retain that privilege because of the blood, sweat, and tears of our veterans. They are the ones who established the Legacy of Excellence we work tirelessly to uphold so please be sure to take time to recognize their sacrifices this Veterans' Day.

Watch out for one another this weekend, and if you see something unsafe...say something!

All dorm residents are required to attend one of the sessions and attendance will be tracked.


For planning purposes, the all-calls should last approximately 30 minutes. The doors will close 5 minutes prior to start.



SecAF visits Whiteman

Secretary of the Air Force Deborah Lee James visited here Nov. 7 - 9, to engage with civic leaders and meet with the Airmen of the world's only B-2 stealth bomber base.

While at Whiteman Air Force Base, James met with leadership from the 509th Bomb Wing, the 131st Bomb Wing, the 442nd Fighter Wing and other tenant units to see firsthand the Total Force Integration model Whiteman AFB has established and to gain a better understanding of Whiteman's commitment to the strategic deterrence mission.

James also had the opportunity to fly in a B-2 Spirit during a training mission and experienced Whiteman's strategic deterrence capability up-close.

"It was an amazing experience," James said. "I was able to witness all of the aspects that it took to make this training mission happen and am thankful for the opportunity."

James also made a visit to the Military and Veterans Success Center at the University of Central Missouri to learn more about the Whiteman Advantage program and see the unique relationship

between Whiteman and the local community.

"You all are very blessed to be in a community that supports you to the degree they do, which was loud and clear here," James said. "You have a lot of committed people who are committed not only to you, but our military at large, and to serving our veterans."

James concluded her visit with an all call and stressed the importance of the nuclear enterprise and global strike mission, while expressing her gratitude and support to the Total Force Airmen in attendance.

"Nowhere have I seen in our United States Air Force a better exemplar of our Total Force," James said. "Our active-duty working with our National Guard, Reserves, and civilians and of course the bedrock of everything we do is our families, who stand behind us at all times."

Prior to departing, James thanked the Airmen for their hospitality and reminded them the priority of the Air Force is to take care of the people first.

"What you do is integral to the total fight, to the total picture, the deterrence, reassurance, as well as to the humanitarian assistance," James said. "Our priority is the people. We are dedicated to taking care of you."






