## Free relationship classes for Airmen in January, February in Warrensburg

The Northside Christian Church in Warrensburg, Missouri is scheduled to host free relationship classes for singles, including Airmen, beginning in January.

These courses make up a joint program between ShowMe Healthy Relationships, Cornerstones of Care and University of Missouri Extension along with two other community organizations in 21 counties of Missouri.

According to the ShowMe Healthy Relationships website, its goal is to help adults build healthier and more-stable relationships, become better parents, manage stress, increase well-being and improve money-management skills.

"At some point in most people's lives, there comes a time that we begin to pursue companionship," said Cory Watson, a family advocacy intervention specialist with the 509th Medical Group. "We may experience 'love' and attraction in middle school and high school, feel heartbreak, and do our best to navigate the direction of our next opportunity for love."

Watson says he feels these courses could help bridge the gap left in most high school curriculums.

"Most high schools don't offer a class on dating or picking a partner," he said. "I think it's safe to say that the



younger we are, the more vulnerable we might be in jumping into relationships too quickly or we may not have a frame of reference that helps us to distinguish when our goals and intent with the relationship are the same as our partner's."

The classes are from 6 p.m.-8 p.m. on Tuesdays from January 22 to February 26, 2019 at the Northside Christian Church, 500 N. Ridgeview Drive.

How to Pick a Partner is a 10-hour course split into a five-week program with a focus on helping singles choose the right partner for a happy and stable relationship.

"These classes are greatly beneficial for individuals who seem to have difficulty finding compatible partners and identifying early red flags in the relationship," said Watson. "This curriculum helps individuals with asking the right questions to inspire meaningful, revealing conversations with a partner."

The courses are designed to help participants learn to judge character based on compatibility, relationship skills, friends and patterns from family and previous relationships.

"It may also help them with resolving some of their own emotional baggage, in turn, helping them to be more ready for a healthy relationship," said Watson. "The curriculum is based on years of research on marital and premarital happiness."

In addition to the singles course, there is a course for couples and several follow-up courses.

The couples course is the same length as the singles course intended to help couples enhance their marriage or relationship through skills such as how to build a healthy friendship, manage conflict and work as a team.

There will be free child care in addition to gift cards and snacks for attendees.

## Advance assignments now available to Airmen deploying for 365-day Extended Deployments

#### Secretary of the Air Force Public Affairs

WASHINGTON (AFNS) - Effective Nov. 1, active duty Airmen selected for an extended deployment may apply to receive an advance assignment up to 16 months prior to the projected Report Not Later Than Date of the assignment.

This means Airmen can have permanent change of station orders in hand immediately after completing all required PCS actions and before departing on their deployment, providing their dependents the option to move early to their next assignment location.


"This change recognizes the need for us to increase stability and predictability for our Airmen and their families and helps our Airmen focus on their mission while deployed," said Lt. Gen. Brian Kelly, Air Force Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower, Personnel and Services. "The ability to receive an assignment prior to departing for an extended deployment allows Airmen to make decisions that are good for them and their families."

Previously, Airmen on extended deployments were required to be deployed for at least 60 days before being notified about potential assignments, and orders were not published earlier than 120 days prior to the new reporting date, making it difficult for Airmen and their families to plan.

In 2017, the Air Force's Personnel Center

chartered a 365-Day Extended Deployments Working Group to look at initiatives to find better ways to accommodate and incentivize year-long deployments. Approximately 400 Airmen per year are selected for 365-day extended deployment.

The 365-day deployment policy change allows Airmen time to out-process from their losing base, provides the option to

move their dependents to the new assignment location, and gives Airmen the option to request movement from their deployed location directly to their new assignment without having to return to their currently assigned unit first.

## Taylor crafts confections at Ozark Inn

In the Ozark Inn Dining Facility, before the sun rises over Whiteman Air Force Base, the lead baker begins crafting culinary creations.

"I can't really complain though," said Airman 1st Class Alexis M. Taylor, shrugging her shoulders and smiling. "I wake up early and spend my day doing what I love."

Taylor, assigned to the 509th Force Support Squadron here, is the mastermind behind the dessert display case.

The Omaha, Nebraska native spends most days covered in baking ingredients, jamming out to her favorite music.

"It's usually R&B or gospel," said Taylor. "Anything upbeat, really. It will have me wiggling here and there as I get through my work."

Taylor, her voice a mellow singsong and her demeanor seemingly as sweet as the food she makes, has a long history with food. **66** I wake up early and spend my day doing what I love."

It all started with easy stuff like breakfast foods when I was 8 or 9 years old, she said.

"I would do this thing where I would add food coloring to everything," said Taylor, beginning to bubble with warm laughter. "Guess what, Mom? We're having green pancakes today!"

Taylor's inspiration comes from the women in her family.

"My mom, my older sister and I would make just about anything from scratch," she said. "My mom would just open up one of her cookbooks and we would find something new to make. I can definitely say that my love of cooking comes from her." Although geographically separated from her family, cooking keeps them connected.

"I can call or text them any time and we'll tell each other which recipes to use and which ones to stay away from," said Taylor.

She brings that desire to experiment to her work in the Air Force.


"I try to take the recipes the Air Force gives me and personalize them as much as I can," said Taylor.

## Air Force announces bases to support B-21 Raider mission

The Air Force has selected Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma, to coordinate maintenance and sustainment of the B-21 Raider and Edwards AFB, California, to lead testing and evaluation of the next generation long-range strike bomber.

The decision to use these bases marks the next milestone in the development and eventual deployment of the B-21, a long-range and highly-survivable aircraft capable of penetrating air defenses and conducting a range of critical missions. The plane is expected to be delivered in the mid-2020s. The Air Force announced last spring that Whiteman Air Force Base in Missouri, Dyess Air Force Base in Texas and Ellsworth Air Force Base in South Dakota have been chosen as possible bases to host the new B-21 bomber.

The Air Force Sustainment Center at Tinker AFB has an Air Logistics Complex with a deep and accomplished history. In selecting Tinker AFB, Air Force leaders acknowledged that the organization has the right knowledge and expertise to support planning for the bomber's depot maintenance.

"With a talented workforce and decades of experience in aircraft maintenance, Tinker AFB is the right place for this critical mission," said Secretary of the Air Force Heather A. Wilson. Robins AFB, Georgia, and Hill AFB, Utah, will support Tinker AFB to ensure the advanced B-21 is maintained and, when necessary, overhauled and upgraded. The workforce at the bases will also be equipped to rebuild parts, assemblies or subassemblies of the plane as well as testing and reclaiming equipment as necessary for depot activations.

Edwards AFB was selected as the location of the B-21's Combined Test Force. The base is home to the Air Force Test Center, which leads testing and evaluation for the Air Force to ensure aircraft and other equipment meet rigorous standards.

The testing program at Edwards AFB is also designed to provide timely, objective and accurate information to decision makers.

"From flight testing the X-15 to the F-117, Edwards AFB in the Mohave Desert has been at the forefront of keeping our Air Force on the cutting edge," said Chief of Staff of the Air Force Gen. David L. Goldfein. "Now, testing the B-21 Raider will begin another historic chapter in the base's history."

Northrop Grumman's Melbourne, Florida, facility is the site of the B-21 Raider design and development headquarters. The B-21 is in the engineering and manufacturing development phase of the acquisition cycle.


